

GET READY TO SHINE!

- Find a hard, flat surface to work on.
- Keep a container nearby to discard the peel-away paper shapes as you go.
- Lay out the sticker sheet with the white peel-away paper shapes facing up (yellow side down).

PEEL, PRESS & REVEAL!

1. Peel up a section of white paper.

Choose an area and remove a peel-away paper shape to expose the sticky surface. Peel slowly, being careful not to tear the paper or touch the sticky surface.

2. Press on a glitter sheet.

Remove the white protective backing, then lay the glitter sheet over the sticky surface (color side up and starting very close to a corner or edge). Rub finger over glitter sheet several times to ensure glitter adheres to sticky surface.

Tip: Keep the glitter sheet flat so the silver side doesn't stick to itself!

3. Reveal instant sparkling art!

Slowly lift the glitter sheet. If there is any sticky surface still un-glittered, reposition the glitter sheet and press again. Then peel away another paper shape, press on more glitter, and repeat.

Helpful Hints:

- Read complete instructions before beginning, and ask an adult for help as needed.
- It's easiest to decorate the stickers while they're either still in the sticker sheet or already applied where you'd like them to go.
- When removing protective backing from glitter sheets, always peel from the corner first.
- When peeling up a paper shape from gingerbread house or stickers, slowly lift a single section with one hand while your other hand secures adjacent (covered) sections. Peel just one or two sections at a time, then apply the glitter before peeling the next section.
- Glitter may be delicate until adhesive fully sets; avoid rubbing or scratching glittered areas while you work.
- Always ask an adult before placing stickers on walls, doors, or furniture. Stickers are not designed to be removable or repositionable, and may leave adhesive residue if removed once placed.

MAKE THE MOST OF YOUR GLITTER SHEETS!

- To conserve glitter, begin using the glitter sheet at one corner (rather than the middle) and keep the shapes you press out very close together. (See diagram.)
- If you have little bits of glitter left, patch them together to fill a larger area. (Just press, reposition, and press again!) You can even combine bits of contrasting colors in the same area to create cool patterns!
- Keep the protective backing and reapply it to the glitter sheets for safe storage.
